This week, TWF welcomed Julie Broussard, the Head of UN Women in China, to Hong Kong. Julie was the guest speaker at a gathering for over a dozen grassroots NGOs and gender academics organised by the Gender Research Centre of CUHK.

Julie spoke about the role of UN Women in facilitating women's advancement in Mainland China, the need for a multi-sector approach to tackle gender issues, and the new draft law which will allow the PRC Government to more closely manage the activities of foreign NGOs on the Mainland.

While Hong Kong has always been and remains the core focus for our work at TWF, like other local NGOs, we are following developments in China closely and we hope that following the enactment of the new law, civil society organisations on the Mainland can continue to serve as critical providers of aid, advocates and watchdogs against abuses of power.
