Dear Stephanie

In case you missed it, last month the EOC released its <u>recommendations</u> for proposed reforms to the existing four anti-dscimination ordinances, following an extensive public consultation exercise.

Out of the total of 73 recommendations, 27 issues were identified by the Commission as higher priority areas for legislative or related forms. These include a number of women related issues including the right of women to return to their previous role after maternity leave, express protection from discrimination for women who are breastfeeding, and strengthening protection from harassment. More controversial provisions touch on extending equal treatment to unmarried cohabiting couples as well as to same sex couples and expanding the concept of racial discrimination to include nationality and residency.

As Bernard Chan, Executive Council member and Chair of the Hong Kong Council of Social Service, wrote in his Op-ed <u>column</u> in the SCMP last week, the EOC is 20 years old this year. The initial legislation from the late 1990s on sex, family status, disability and race discrimination was important but a lot remains to be done.

At TWF, we congratulate outgoing EOC Chair, Dr York Chow, and the EOC secretariat for successfully steering the Discrimination Law Review through amidst at times raucous public debate and we hope the Government will respond positively.
