Dear Lisa

TWF has always had close ties to Cambridge and we were delighted to be part of the Cambridge festivities in Hong Kong the week before last.

In addition to TWF's scholarship scheme - now in its fourth year - which sends deserving HK students to pursue the M Phil in Gender Studies at Cambridge, TWF is also forging closer ties with both women-only colleges, Newnham and Murray Edwards, and we are engaging in knowledge sharing with the University on its policies and programmes to retain and promote female academic talent.

In a meeting with TWF board members, the Vice-Chancellor, Sir Leszek Boryswiewicz, discussed how Cambridge was the first of the Russell Group institutions to publish an Equal Pay Review examining gender disparity in the pay received by academic and administrative staff. Cambridge is also just one of seven higher education institutions that has an Athena SWAN silver institutional award for supporting women's careers in the STEM subjects, and it was the first HEI to sign up to the 30% Club. The university's Senior Academic Promotions scheme has recently been reviewed to ensure all contributions are treated fairly and has resulted in more women being promoted which should help to address the historical gender imbalance at senior levels. Meanwhile, Cambridge's innovative Returning Carers' fund is available to staff members who return to work after a break because of caring responsibilities and facilitates them in re-kickstarting their career.

In 2014, the university published "The Meaning of Success: Insights from Women at Cambridge" which celebrates the life experiences of successful women at Cambridge and provides an opportunity to reflect on how success is recognised and rewarded, while questioning if there is scope to redefine and extend the qualities and attributes we associate with being successful. To quote from the concluding chapter: "This book is just one part of the demanding conversation that Cambridge is having about how to become more inclusive and therefore able to realise the talents of the women and men in its community. It is both a snapshot in time and a bold enquiry into how the university can expect more of itself. But Cambridge exists as part of a wider society and a wider intellectual environment. As such, the questions identified as worthy of further debate at Cambridge are likely to prove of value beyond the university."

We applaud Cambridge for recognising the importance of diversity and inclusion, of not being afraid to openly ask the difficult questions, and of not shirking the challenge of reforming an institution that has 800 years of history.
