Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action +25

"We must resist all challenges to the hard-won affirmation of what we know: that women's rights are human rights – in their universality and indivisibility, and for all women, in their full and free diversity." - Michelle Bachelet, United Nations Commissioner for Human Rights

Last Friday marked the 25th Anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women and the adoption of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (BPFA) –the most comprehensive and progressive blueprint for the rights of women and girls around the world. How much have we progressed since then?

There have been significant global shifts towards closing the gender gap since 1995. Political representation is on the rise. We have seen improvements in education with estimates that, in this area, it will take only 12 years to reach gender parity, with health and survival close to parity as well. Child marriages are declining and we have witnessed half of the countries where female genital mutilation is 'endemic' introduce legislation to outlaw the practice. The #MeToo movement changed the conversation around sexual harassment and rape, and continues to unite and empower women around the world. Many organisations are taking action on the gender pay gap, with some countries such as the UK, enforcing legislation around the issue.

On November 5, we will be hosting our Annual Gala Dinner – be sure to Save the Date!

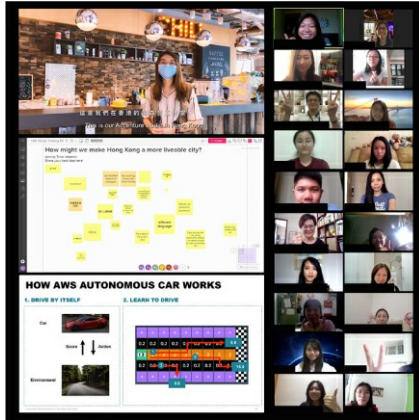

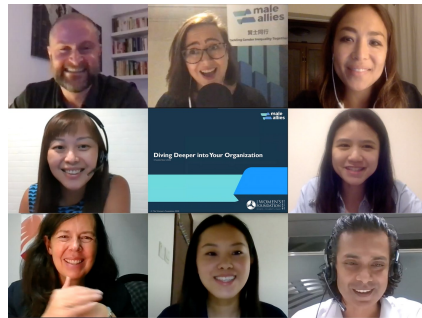


Girls Go Tech Programme x Accenture Innovative Experience Virtual Workshop

BEIJING DECLARATION AND PLATFORM FOR ACTION: IN FOCUS

For the next month, to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the adoption of the [Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action](#) – the most progressive blueprint for the rights of women and girls around the world – we will feature one key focus area each week and note how it informs TWF's work.



Women in Power and Decision-making

Equal representation at senior levels of decision-making matters. In business, there is overwhelming evidence that greater board gender diversity improves governance, decision-making, and the bottom line. In policy-making, women's representation helps advance gender equality and affects the range of policy issues discussed.

Despite this, women are under-represented in leadership positions around the globe, and Hong Kong is no exception. As at July 2020, percentage of women on Hang Seng Index (HSI) boards is 13.7%, putting us behind other countries in the region including Malaysia (23.7%), Singapore (16.2%) and India (17%). Among these companies, there are only 16 female executive directors and 1 female CEO.

To increase representation, we need to ensure equal access and participation at all levels of decision-making and this is core to TWF's work. We founded the 30% Club Hong Kong Chapter in 2013, which works with chairpersons, nominating committees, investors and others to increase the number of women appointed to listed boards. Two years ago, we launched a Boardroom Series for Women Leaders to build the pipeline of board-ready women, connecting highly qualified women to the right people and positions, and providing the skills necessary for the transition to the boardrooms of NGOs, schools, advisory bodies and companies. Our Mentoring Programme, Reverse Mentoring Pilot and Male Allies Initiative all also work to address key issues preventing women from entering into senior leadership roles.

Given the vast changes wrought by COVID-19, there is no more critical time than now to have gender diverse leadership, which will equip us with the effective decision making and the diversity of perspectives needed to lead us through these challenging times ahead.
